Budget Reconciliation and the 117th Congress: What You Need to Know

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Welcome to reconciliation

- The Senate filibuster's 60-vote threshold is an obstacle for the Biden administration to pass sweeping legislation under the traditional legislative process
- To avoid the filibuster, congressional Democrats are advancing a sizable COVID-19-related relief package using the budget reconciliation process
- In short: budget reconciliation provides the Senate the ability to fast-track certain types of legislation with only 51 votes

Is the current COVID-19 package the only time Congress will use reconciliation?

- Reconciliation may be used once each fiscal year. Because Congress has yet to pass a budget resolution for the current year, they have two budget resolutions available to them (FY 2021, FY2022)
- The current reconciliation package is focused on COVID-19 relief
- The second reconciliation package will likely involve significant tax changes, infrastructure and climate spending, and a general economic stimulus



Reconciliation basics

- The Budget Act charges each chamber's Budget Committee with annually passing a budget resolution
 - The resolution may give committees reconciliation instructions (spending targets) to report legislation that increases or decreases a specified amount of revenue or mandatory spending
 - The Budget Committees send the committee package to the floor
- In the Senate, consideration of the reconciliation package is time limited, is not subject to a filibuster, and can pass with a majority vote
- Previous reconciliation examples:
 - Trump administration's Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017
 - Some of the Obama administration's Affordable Care Act

Are there limitations on the use of reconciliation?

- The Budget Act prohibits the reconciliation package from containing "extraneous matters." In the Senate this can be enforced via a point of order under the "Byrd Rule"
- Matters are considered extraneous if they do not change outlays or revenues or the changes in outlays or revenue are "merely incidental" to goals of the provision
- This subjective decision is made by the Senate parliamentarian
- If the parliamentarian rules that a matter is extraneous, this ruling only can be overridden with 60 votes.



Items likely to survive a point of order and invocation of the Byrd Rule

- Most tax treatment whether raising or lowering corporate and/or individual tax rates
- Federal purchases
- Medicare and Medicaid
- Federal civilian and military retirement
- SNAP (formerly known as food stamps)



Items likely to be struck from a reconciliation package

- Minimum wage increase
- DC statehood
- Insurance regulations
- Social Security
- Conservation programs
- OSHA penalties
- Direct FDIC to develop a risk-based insurance program
- Abstinence education
- Gun reform measures



Outlook – what does this mean for you?

- With narrow majorities in both chambers, the Biden administration and congressional Democrats will use reconciliation to enact their policy goals
- The scale of these bills will be massive
- For those with a policy interest in reconciliation, the best strategy is to engage with members and staff as early in the process as possible



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
